Advent Inspiration: The "O" Antiphons, Scriptural References and SMS Students' Reflections

December 17: O Sapientia (O Wisdom); See Isaiah 11:2-3; 28:29.

O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

Students' Reflection:

Jesus followed the Father's plan and was wise enough to save us from sin to show us God's love. We should walk in the path of Jesus who will teach us wisdom and love. He shows us how to carry our own small crosses to follow Him.

December 18: O Adonai (O Lord); See Isaiah 11:4-5; 33:22.

O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power.

Students' Reflection:

God gave us the Ten Commandments and the Holy Spirit to help us to follow his laws and do what is right.

December 19: O Radix Jesse (O Root of Jesse); See Isaiah 1:1; 11:10.

O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay.

Students' Reflection: Jesus is the flower that came from Jesse's stem He will save us and give us life.

December 20: O Clavis David (O Key of David); See Isaiah 9:6; 22:22.

O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

Students' Reflection: Jesus opens the gates to God's eternal Kingdom of heaven for us and makes us pure of heart.

December 21: O Oriens (O Rising Sun); See Isaiah 9:1.

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

Students' Reflection: Jesus is the light of the world! He is eternal light and justice

December 22: O Rex Gentium (O King of the Nations); See Isaiah 9:5; 2:4.

O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust.

Students' Reflection: Jesus comes to unite all people and save all of humanity from evil.

December 23: O Emmanuel (God with us); See Isaiah 7:14.

O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!

Students' Reflection: The Messiah is our King and judge. He always forgives our sins. He will rule our hearts and save us.

A Final Note: According to Professor Robert Greenberg of the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, the Benedictine monks of the first millennium arranged these antiphons with a definite purpose. If one starts with the last title and the first letter of each one - Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia - the Latin words "Ero cras" are formed, meaning, Tomorrow, I will come. Therefore, the Lord Jesus, whose coming we have prepared for in Advent and whom we have addressed in these seven Messianic titles, now speaks to us, Tomorrow, I will come. So the O Antiphons not only bring intensity to our Advent preparation, but bring it to a joyful conclusion. Come, Lord Jesus!
